



# Girls soccer: Glenelg and Reservoir play to double -overtime standoff

Atholton, Centennial, Marriotts Ridge, Hammond and River Hill win their games

With roughly 20 seconds left in regulation, Reservoir midfielder Katlyn Axenfeld dribbled inside box and crossed the ball to her left. Teammate Megan Jackson was wide open and didn't hesitate with her shot.

But standing between Jackson and the net was Glenelg goalie Brooke Carey.

"I breathed a sigh of relief when she kicked it right at me," Carey said. "I was at the right place."

Carey and her defensive teammates were the right spot throughout Wednesday's double-overtime game against the host defending county champions that ended in a scoreless tie.

\*There defense was really good," said Reservoir sophomore Amanda Jackson, who had scored four goals in her team's first three games.

"Glenelg is phenomenal defensively and they are very well disciplined defensively," said Reservoir coach Josh Sullivan.

Glenelg graduated its top three scorers who accounted for 40 goals. The Gladiators (0-0-1 league, 2-1-1 overall) don't have the speed up top or offensive weapons of a year ago, but they do have a solid defense that will keep them in games.

Glenelg coach Dean Sheridan was pleased with the result.

"Yes I am. For where we are right now," said Sheridan, whose15-player team had only two substitutes available against Reservoir.

Beside Carey, Glenelg got excellent play from sweeper Liz Ebeling, backs Megan Pawtowski and Casey Vantucci and stopper Erin Kaminsky.

Glenelg scattered some scoring opportunities throughout the game, but Reservoir (0-0-1, 2-1-1) used its speed up top to create many more offensive threats. But either Glenelg's defense made the stop or the Gators sent shots over and around the goal.

"I think it's a wake-up call," said Megan Jackson, a senior and sister of Amanda

"Obviously we're not really happy with a tie. It just shows we have to practice harder and take things more seriously because we're just not going to win everything. We can't think that we're better than everyone."

Reservoir coach Josh Sullivan, who has a lot of players back from last year's team that lost in the Class 3A state final, said he was "frustrated with the result, but not with how we played."

Said Sullivan, "I felt pretty good with how we played. We did a much better job in the second half of developing plays and using the width of the field. We just couldn't finish, and that happens some games."

### Atholton 2, Howard 1

Bridgette Snyder scored two first-half goals to lead Atholton (1-0-0, 1-1-0) over visiting Howard (0-2-0, 1-2-0). Maddie Boccio and Allison Morton had assists.

Caitlyn Whitford scored for Howard with about 15 minutes left in regulation.

## Centennial 2, Long Reach 1

Centennial rallied from a 1-0 halftime deficit to defeat visiting Long Reach.

Kristen Fawole scored in the third minute of the game off an assist from Katie Haarer to give Long Reach (0-1-0, 3-1-0) the lead.

Darby Sinunu scored off an assist from Taylor Bourg to tie the game for Centennial ((1-0-1, 3-1-0). With about 20 minutes left in the game, Bourg sent a crossing pass to Danielle Entrot, who connected for the game winner.
