



Girls soccer: Glenelg's 2-0 victory over Centennial is Gladiators' seventh shutout

Howard, Wilde Lake, Atholton and Reservoir also hold opposition scoreless

Glenelg's girls soccer team scored twice in the opening 10 minutes and recorded its seventh straight shutout in a 2-0 victory Friday night at Centennial.

Both goals started from corner kicks. Christina Kaminsky and Rachel McCarriher scored goals and Amanda Lyons got an assist.

Glenelg (7-1-2, 8-2-2), which plays at Archbishop Spalding on Monday and at Long Reach on Tuesday in a make-up game, has allowed only three goals against county teams. The Gladiators opened the season with a scoreless tie against Reservoir, then lost 1-0 in double overtime to visiting Mt. Hebron.

A 2-2 tie against Atholton left Glenelg at 0-1-2 in the county, but since then it has won seven straight, including 1-0 victories over River Hill (double overtime) and 2010 county champion Marriotts Ridge. The Gladiators have scored only 15 goals against county competition.

Centennial (5-4-1, 7-5-1) has been held scoreless in three of its last four games. The Eagles play Howard on Monday in a make-up game.

Reservoir 1, Mt. Hebron 0

Megan Jackson scored off an assist from Amanda Jackson midway through the first half to lift Reservoir (8-2-1, 10-3-1) over visiting Mt. Hebron (5-5-1, 6-7-1).

Reservoir, the 2009 county champions, tied Glenelg and lost one-goal games to 2010 county champion Marriotts Ridge (in overtime) and River Hill.

Mt. Hebron handed Glenelg its only county loss, 1-0, in double overtime on Sept. 21. The Vikings lost one-goal games to Marriotts Ridge, River Hill and Reservoir.

Atholton 1, Hammond 0

Bridgette Snyder's goal was the difference as Atholton (5-4-2, 5-5-2) defeated host Hammond (1-10, 2-10).

Nine of the Raiders' 12 games were decided by one goal, including eight against county teams. They were 4-4 in one-goal games against county teams.

Hammond's lone county victory was against Oakland Mills, 2-1, on Sept. 15. The Golden Bears were held scoreless in seven games, including their last six of the regular season.

Wilde Lake 3, Long Reach 0

Gillian Sawyer scored three goals to lead Wilde Lake (3-8, 3-9) past visiting Long Reach (3-7, 6-7).

Wilde Lake, which ended the regular-season on a two-game win streak, posted county wins against Hammond, Oakland Mills and Long Reach. Sawyer scored in eight games, including the last three. She has 10 goals.

Long Reach, which hosts Glenelg Tuesday in a make-up game, has lost five straight. The Lightning was shut out in three of those games.

Howard 2, Oakland Mills 0

Julia Coccozza scored 15 minutes into the first half off an assist from Kristen Shea to help Howard (4-5-1, 5-5-1) over visiting Oakland Mills (0-11, 2-11).

Emma Bruzdinski scored on a header off a corner kick by Coccozza 10 minutes into the second half.

Oakland Mills failed to earn a county victory for the second year in a row and was shut out in eight county games.
